Poll investors, asset managers, owners, rehabbers and sellers of vacant property to understand the issues they face when securing a vacant property in economically distressed areas.


Determine the preferred method/material used to secure a vacant property in economically distressed areas.






More than 90% of respondents are involved with properties in economically distressed areas





Material respondents have used to secure vacant property in economically distressed areas




























